This Grace@Home Let's Talk Guide provides discussion questions and activities that you may use to facilitate conversations about God and His Word in your home. The focus is on those chapters that are most likely to promote meaningful conversations for all ages of family members.

1Chronicles 5

Write your own family genealogy, starting with your dad, son of... How far back can you go?

Questions:

1. What is your favorite name in this chapter? Which is the funniest?
2. Why did God listen to the prayer of the Reubenites, Gadites, and half tribe of Manasseh and give them victory?
3. What is an example of how you can put your trust in the Lord daily?
4. What happened later when these tribes served other gods? What is a way that we serve things or people ahead of God?

1Chronicles 13

Think of something worth celebrating. Then praise God with music; be creative and use any instruments in your house or any item you can turn into an instrument. Watch this video and sing along if you know the song:

Questions:

1. David played music and sang as a young shepherd boy in his father's fields. How did he use these talents for God as an adult?
2. Adults – what talents do you use now that you started to develop as a kid? Kids – what are you learning to do now that you might be able to do as an adult? How can God use these talents?
3. What mistake did David make [Exodus 25:14]? What does this show about God's value of obedience?
4. What happened to the house where the ark stayed? Would you want to see and come close to the Ark of the Covenant? Why or why not?

1Chronicles 15

Michal despised David's singing and dancing, even though it pleased God. What's one thing God has asked you to do that you've been too worried about what other people think to be obedient? Listen to this recording of "Undignified" together. What is David Crowder singing about?

Questions:

1. What was different about the way the Ark of the Covenant traveled to Jerusalem this time?
2. Do you think God wants us to ask Him about the details or order of events in our lives? Why or why not?
3. What role did music play in today's chapter? What instruments were mentioned? How does music play a part in the life of a believer?
4. Why did Michal despise David in her heart? What might that tell you about her relationship with God?

1Chronicles 17

Write a letter to God. Write, "For you know me, your servant, [name], Lord." Tell Him or draw something He knows about you that no one else does and thank Him for loving you.

Questions:

1. What did David want to do for God? Why? Have you ever wanted to do anything for God because you love Him? If so, what?
2. How did God respond to David's desire? Why?
3. How did David respond to God's promise to Him? Who is David's son through whom this promise will be fulfilled?
4. This promise is ultimately pointing to someone several generations from David whose throne will be established forever but comes from the lineage of David. Who is this passage referring to?

1Chronicles 22

Everyone share some challenge that they have coming up. The entire family replies, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged." You might want to post this verse on your door to read as you leave the house each day.

Questions:

1. What did David do to help prepare for the temple that Solomon would build?
2. What words of advice does David give his son Solomon? How could these words also apply to you in your daily life?
3. What might it look like practically to set your heart and soul to seek the Lord?
4. One of Solomon's big missions in life was to build the temple. What do you think one of your missions in life might be?

1Chronicles 28

Read 1Chronicles 9-10 to each child, but complete verse 10 with something specific for your child. "Consider now, the Lord has chosen you to [help your mom, be kind to your sister...]." Try saying this out loud to each person in your family.

Questions:

1. What does David tell the people of Israel to do?
2. What does God know about our heart and mind? How does that make you feel?
3. What are some of the things that David gave Solomon to help him build God's house?
4. Imagine you were a person in the crowd listening to David. How would you feel about Israel, Solomon, and God at the end of this speech?
