

Let's Talk: Day 113-Whole Bible

Today's Reading: Judges 6-7, Proverbs 8-9 / Family Chapter: Judges 7

Discuss as a family if it is possible for you to get by with less. What could you live without?

Questions:

1. Why did the first 22,000 people leave the army? Do you think you would have been one of them?
2. What was the second test and how many soldiers were sent home?
3. What would you have thought if you were one of the remaining 300 soldiers? Why did God want to deliver Israel with so few people? How did God encourage Gideon?
4. How did God give Gideon the victory? Has God ever used you when the odds were against you to do something great?

Let's Talk: Day 114

Today's Reading: Judges 8-9, Proverbs 10 / Family Chapter: Proverbs 10

Read the chapter and then have each family member (or team of two if one doesn't read yet) draw a picture of one verse. See if the other family members can guess the verse.

Questions:

1. What kind of pattern do you see in the first several verses?
2. Pick one of these verses that means something to you and share why.
3. There are several verses regarding our lips/mouth/speech. What is something you can apply to your life this week?
4. What does God say about laziness? When you have a job to do, do you do it with your best effort and without needing to be reminded?

Let's Talk: Day 115

Today's Reading: Judges 10-11, Proverbs 11 / Family Chapter:
Judges 10

If you were the Son of Dodo, would you change your name? God has a sense of humor. Tell your favorite joke to the family.

Question

1. What happened to Israel again in verses 6 to 9? Are there certain kinds of sins that you consistently struggle against?
2. How did the children of Israel respond in words and actions when God said He wasn't going to deliver them anymore?
3. What things/people do we sometimes rely on to save us instead of God?
4. What do you think is the key to you living a life of victory?

Let's Talk: Day 116

Today's Reading: Judges 12-13, Proverbs 12 / Family Chapter:
Judges 13

If you could have any superpower what would it be? Have some fun debating and discussing this topic. Parents: Share some questions you asked when you found out you were expecting a child. Children: draw what you think the angel looked like based on the chapter's description.

Questions:

1. What familiar problem have the Israelites gotten themselves into at the start of this chapter?
2. Who did the angel appear to and what did he promise?
3. What was the baby destined to be from womb to grave? (cross reference Numbers 6)
4. Do you think God already knows what He wants you to be when you grow up? What do you think it is? Are you praying to God to show you what that is?

Let's Talk: Day 117

Today's Reading: Judges 14-15, Proverbs 13-14 / Family Chapter: Proverbs 13

Write your own proverb to fit your family traditions or values. It can be silly or serious

Questions:

1. Solomon spends a lot of time in Proverbs talking about our mouth and the words that come out of our mouth. What do you learn from this chapter?
2. How do you explain verse seven? Does your family live any part of that verse? If so, how?
3. How can you be wise? How can you be foolish?
4. What does God say about correction? Is it good or bad?

Let's Talk: Day 118

Today's Reading: Judges 16-17, Proverbs 15 / Family Chapter: Judges 16

Every hero has a strength and weakness. Brainstorm as many Bible heroes and/or comic heroes as you can and try to remember both their strength and their weakness. Only Christ has no weakness.

Questions:

1. What was Samson's super power? What skill or strength has God given you?
2. What was Samson's super weakness? In what areas are you weak?
3. What did Delilah want from Samson? Was Samson wise to choose to be with her? Why or why not? What can you do to prevent being controlled by your weaknesses?
4. How did Delilah finally get what she wanted? How could Samson have responded differently to Delilah? Do you ever give in to people that you should not? How can you stand strong next time?

Today's Reading: Today is the weekly OFF day

Mystery Question for the upcoming week: What region was Ruth from? Ruth 2

Take a few minutes to pray for each other as a family. Pray that you would live different from the Israelites and their cycle of sin. You could pray for the person on your right or you could take a walk together while praying – be creative.
