

## Let's Talk: Day 197-Whole Bible

Today's Reading: 1Chronicles 29-2Chronicles 1, Luke 2/ Family Chapter: 2Chronicles 1

Everyone share their heart's desire. Pray that you will desire what God desires for you.

Questions:

1. What did Solomon ask for from God? Did God answer his request? How?
2. If God asked you the same question, how would you respond?
3. What did God give Solomon besides his request? Why?
4. What is the danger of having too many riches? Do you think this happened to Solomon?

## Let's Talk: Day 198

Today's Reading: 2Chronicles 2-4, Luke 3 / Family Chapter: 2Chronicles 3

If you were going to build a temple to God, what would it look like? Draw a picture.

Questions:

1. What words come to mind to describe the temple that Solomon built for God?
2. What colors would you find in the temple? What does that make you think of?
3. What details are included in the making of the temple? Why do you think God wants us to know these details?
4. In 1Corinthians 6:19 it says that our body is also the temple of God. What things might we do (or not do) to keep our body special/holy for God?

## Let's Talk: Day 199

Today's Reading: 2Chronicles 5-6, Luke 4 / Family Chapter:  
2Chronicles 5

Play catch. The thrower proclaims: "He is good," and the catcher replies: "His love endures forever." How many times can you throw it back and forth without dropping it?

Questions:

1. What did Solomon do while he brought the ark to the temple? Why do you think he did that?
2. What noises, smells, and sights do you think you would have noticed if you had been in the crowd on the day the temple was dedicated?
3. If you had to come up with a one sentence chant or "chorus" to sing to God, what would it be?
4. What happened at the end of the chapter? If we are the temple of God today, could this ever apply to us? If so, how?

## Let's Talk: Day 200

Today's Reading: 2Chronicles 7-9, Luke 5 / Family Chapter: Luke 5

Each person completes this sentence, "I do not understand why I should \_\_\_\_\_, but nevertheless, at Your word I will do it."

Questions:

1. What did Jesus tell the seasoned fishermen to do? Put yourself in their shoes. Why might it be hard to follow a stranger's direction? Did they? What was the result?
2. For what reasons did multitudes of people begin to follow Jesus?
3. Do you think you would have followed Jesus? Would you have been one of the crowd or a disciple? Explain.
4. Why did Jesus eat dinner and talk with the "sinners?" Isn't everyone a sinner? How can you show love to people that others view as outcasts?

## Let's Talk: Day 201

Today's Reading: 2Chronicles 10-12, Luke 6 / Family Chapter:  
2Chronicles 12

Turn your back on one of your adult family members and talk to everyone else but them. How did that make them feel? Read about Rehoboam doing the same thing to God.

Questions:

1. When Rehoboam felt strong what mistake did he make? What happened when Rehoboam forgot about God?
2. How did Rehoboam later turn back to God? How did God deliver him?
3. What is the difference between forgiveness and consequences? What negative consequences did Rehoboam still have from turning away from God in the first place?
4. How can having needs in our life where we have to depend on God be good for us? Do you have any needs in your life right now? Take a moment to thank God for them.

## Let's Talk: Day 202

Today's Reading: 2Chronicles 13-15, Luke 7 / Family Chapter:  
2Chronicles 15

Work on a task together such as pulling weeds or doing dishes. As you work, practice this verse: "Be strong, and do not let your hands be weak: for your work shall be rewarded." Then enjoy a treat!

Questions:

1. When will the Lord be with Asa?
2. How did Asa help the people return to following God? What did God give them as a result?
3. How can you follow God with all your heart? Are there any idols in your life (things you put ahead of God) that you need to throw away?
4. Asa helped the nation of Israel follow God. What people do you know that can help you follow God (think both adults and kids)?
