Today's Reading: Ezekiel 38-39, 1Timothy 4-5 / Family Chapter: 1Timothy 4

Today's chapter talks some of consistency in the Christian life. Parents, share with your kids some of your spiritual practices you have to stay close to Christ.

Questions:

- 1. What kind of exercise does Paul suggest we do?
- 2. How do you do that daily?
- 3. Was Timothy old or young? What does Paul have to say about Timothy's age?
- 4. How can you be an example in the ways listed in verse 12?

Today's Reading: Ezekiel 40, 1Timothy 6 – 2Timothy 1 / Family Chapter: 2Timothy 1

Chapter: 2Timothy 1

Family Challenge: Memorize 2Timothy 1:7. Say it five times in the tub or shower, five times as you put on your pajamas, and five more times before you get into bed.

Questions:

- 1. What did God give us? What did He not give us? How can this help you when problems arise?
- 2. From where is Paul writing this? How do you know?
- 3. What influence did Timothy's grandmother have on his interest in Jesus? How does your walk with Jesus influence other people for good or bad?
- 4. How did Jesus abolish death and what does that mean for us?

Let's Talk: Day 325

Today's Reading: Ezekiel 41-43, 2Timothy 2-3 / Family Chapter: 2Timothy 2

Choose a sport or game to play as a family. What rules did you follow? What rules do you follow to please God?

Questions:

- 1. How many generations of discipleship can you find in verse two? Are you being discipled by someone or are you discipling someone else? How far back in a "spiritual genealogy" can you go with the person who is or has discipled you?
- 2. What are some of the similarities between following Christ and being a good soldier?
- 3. How are we cautioned to use our words? Do you know any situation where people were divided over words that were said? What happened?
- 4. What kind of vessels are in a house? What kind of vessel do you want to be for the house of God? How can you keep your "vessel" clean?

Let's Talk: Day 326

Today's Reading: Ezekiel 44-45, 2Timothy 4-Titus 1 / Family Chapter: 2Timothy 4

Use words of hope to cheer someone up. Make a card for a sick or lonely person, with a cheerful picture and a note that lets them know they are loved. If you don't know someone to deliver it to, take it to a hospital or retirement home.

Questions:

- This chapter is the last recorded words of Paul. What are some of the final things he tells Timothy to do?
- 2. How does Paul summarize his own life? Can you think of an older person you know that has been faithful like Paul? Tell him/her "thank you" for their example this week.

- 3. Who is staying with Paul while he is writing this letter? Who would you want to be with you if you were in a deep trial or nearing the end of your life?
- 4. When Paul felt alone who stood with him? How did that strengthen his faith? Have you ever had a time when you felt alone but God clearly delivered you? If so, share.

Pray as a family. Include thanks to God for a specific individual who loves God's people.

Questions:

- 1. Who is writing this letter with Paul? How do we know him? From where are they writing?
- 2. Describe Philemon's character as Paul sees it. Do you know anyone like that?
- 3. Why is Paul writing this letter to Philemon? Do you think Philemon will do what Paul is asking?
- 4. What do you think Onesimus is thinking through all this?
