Look for this:

- Mark 12: What Jesus said about paying taxes
- Mark 13: Who knows the day and hour of Christ's return
- Mark 14: What happens when a shepherd (leader) is struck
- Mark 15: What inscription was above Jesus on the cross
- Mark 16: What the women initially said after visiting the tomb
- Psalm 22: Compare Psalm 22:1 to Mark 15:34

Tips:

- In Mark's fast-paced fashion, this section records Jesus' last days and hours.
- Jesus faces conflict with the religious authorities who try to find a way to discredit him [Mark 12].
- Jesus describes the Last Days. He warns us to watch for the signs and to pray (Mark 13).
- Mark 14 describes the Last Supper and gives us a way to remember Him while we are waiting for His return.
- Jesus is crucified and rises from the dead (Mark 15-16).

•	Notice how Jesus quotes Psalm 22 as He is on the cross. In Psalm 22, you see what Jesus was thinking and feeling while on the cross. It's a powerful reminder of the reality of the crucifixion.
