Look for this:

- **Romans 8:** What cannot separate a believer from the love of God
- **Romans 9:** Why Israel was unable to attain righteousness
- **Romans 10:** What Paul says people do to be saved
- **Romans 11:** How God grafts Gentiles into Israel's "tree" spiritually
- **Romans 12:** How to respond instead of taking revenge
- **Isaiah 53:** Compare Isaiah 53:1 to Romans 10:16

Tips:

- In this section of Romans, Paul compares God's faithfulness to Jewish unfaithfulness (most had not accepted Christ).
- Paul was deeply concerned for his Jewish brethren and more concerned about their welfare than his own. If it were possible, he would be willing to spend eternity in Hell separated from Christ rather than see his fellow Jews reject Christ.
- Romans 10 offers a clear process for getting saved in verses 9-10 and 13.

- Romans 12 begins the practical section of Romans. Whereas chapters 1-11 deal with doctrine, this section ushers in the believer's response to the doctrine that Paul had given.
