Tips:

- The book of 1Corinthians is one of Paul's letters to the church in Corinth. Paul had planted the church in this very affluent and sinful Greek city (Acts 18:1-18) and wrote them after his departure (1Cor 5:9-11). Unfortunately, sinful cultural influences and their own spiritual immaturity required him to systematically address each church problem in this letter.
- In 1Corinthians, Paul addresses a host of major problems in the church at Corinth. These issues include deep divisions in the church, arrogance of its members, denial of key doctrines, and

their acceptance of openly sinful lifestyles. For each issue, Paul brings it into the open and counsels them on its Biblical solution.
