### Look for this:

- **Matthew 24:** What will characterize the days of Jesus' return
- **Matthew 25:** How people can feed or provide a drink to Jesus
- **Matthew 26:** How Jesus prayed in the garden to avoid the cross
- **Matthew 27:** What was torn when Jesus died on the cross
- **Matthew 28:** How Jesus charged us to make disciples worldwide
- **Psalm 90:** Compare Psalm 90:13 to Matthew 24:42

### Tips:

- Matthew 24 and 25 contain an extensive discussion of the end times. This is called the Olivet Discourse since Jesus talked with His disciples on the Mount of Olives, just east of Jerusalem.
- Look for the Old Testament Scriptures that Jesus quoted in Matthew 24 (Daniel).
- Matthew 26 and 27 tell of the Crucifixion including what Jesus told the disciples as the time approached, how He faced the Sanhedrin, how He faced Pilate, and the Crucifixion itself.

- Matthew 28 tells of Christ's Resurrection and ends with the Great Commission (Mat 28:18-20).
