

Tips:

- In the process of David becoming king, there was much turmoil and changing alliances. Both Abner and Ishbosheth were murdered.
- David wanted to bring the Ark to Jerusalem. His approach was flawed as he did not ask God's permission and he did not use the method God prescribed for moving the Ark (Levites carrying it on their shoulders).
- There is a future for Israel because God gave David a throne forever. David never forgot what God had done. He praised God for His mercy and believed God's promises for the future.
