

Tips:

- The kings of Israel (and sometimes Judah) give us many examples of what **not** to do. We should **not** listen to advice that conflicts with God’s Word, worship anything other than God, ignore God’s warnings, or fail to seek God’s help.
- God wants us to seek Him, obey Him, trust Him, and be strong in the Lord. Notice how God told Elijah when to hide and when to show himself. The key is to do things when and how God directs.
