

Tips:

- The custom of the time was to wad up a napkin if you did not intend to return and fold it neatly if you did plan to return. The folded napkin is like a message, "I'll be back."
- Joseph of Arimathea risked disfavor and discipline of the Sanhedrin when he claimed Jesus body and placed them in his new tomb. His friends may have shunned him. By touching a dead body, he eliminated his ability to participate in the Passover Feast.
