## 1Chronicles

---

### Overview

The books of [1Chronicles](#) and [2Chronicles](#) record much of the same history as [1 and 2Samuel](#) and [1 and 2Kings](#). However the books of [1 and 2Chronicles](#) differ in a variety of ways including:

- Focusing only on the southern kingdom of Judah
- Emphasizing the Jewish Temple
- Ending with the decree to allow the captives to return

### Genealogies

The exacting detail of the genealogies played an important role in Israel after their captivity. They reestablished each tribe's membership and sense of history and documented the ancestral lines of the priests and Messiah. The genealogies also contain rich stories buried within them. On a personal basis, reading the genealogies reminds people of God's desire for each generation to leave another generation following God.

### Point of Interest

Notice that the method of carrying the ark differs when you compare [1Chronicles 15](#) to [2Samuel 6](#). The construction of the ark was for people to carry it on their shoulders rather than placing it in a cart. Consider the problems that arose when they placed the ark on a cart.

## Personal Reflection and Application

Notice in **1Chronicles 14** that when David was faced with a challenge, he asked God what to do. Soon after that, he faced a similar challenge. He didn't assume that he should do the same thing as he did the last time. Again, he asked God what he should do.

- Do you ask God each time before you make a major move?
- Do you double check with God even if the situation is similar to one you have already had?

## Small Group Conversation Guide

In **1Chronicles 26** David placed emphasis on assigning porters to maintain the house of the Lord.

Porters had two basic responsibilities.

- Guard the gates and the comings and goings
- Guard the treasure and things dedicated to God

It is important to guard what comes in and out of our gates (eyes, ears, tongue).

- What can we do to guard what comes in our eye gate and ear gate?
- What can we do to guard what comes out of our tongue gate?

It is important to guard whatever we dedicate to God and to guard ourselves as the temple of God.

- What kind of things do we dedicate to God and how can we guard them?
- How can we keep our temple in good shape for God?
