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## Exodus

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### High-Level Outline

Exo 1-18	The Exodus	Divine Power	New Life Redemption	Freedom, Liberty

In [Exodus 7-12](#), God unleashes 10 plagues (likely over several months) designed to judge the gods of the Egyptians, show His superiority to them, and ultimately deliver Israel from bondage.

Note how the Passover lamb ([Exo 12](#)) foreshadows Jesus' sacrifice on the cross ([1Cor 5:7](#)) - the pure and innocent lamb is sacrificed to offer its blood to protect others.

The Tabernacle was Israel's portable worship center. As you read God's detailed design ([Exo 25-30](#)) and Israel's meticulous construction ([Exo 36-40](#)), consider the many ways it foreshadowed Jesus Christ.

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## Personal Reflection and Application

Notice that Moses is an evangelist in the first twelve chapters of Exodus. The hurdles he faces are impatience, complacency, and disobedience.

### Impatience

Moses didn't wait for God's timing ([Exo 2:11-15](#), [Acts 7:22-25](#)). Do you wait for God's timing? An aggressive approach seldom works. Establish a relationship with the person, then wait for God to give you an opening to share your faith.

### Complacency

When God was ready, Moses had doubts and excuses ([Exo 3:7-4:17](#)). When you begin to make excuses for not doing what you know God wants, consider what He has done in your life.

### Disobedience

Moses had failed to obey God in the matter of circumcising his own son ([Exo 4:18-26](#)). He failed as a leader in his own family. How seriously do you take your responsibility to teach your children the Word of God?

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## Small Group Conversation Guide
