Tips:

- Abram's (Abraham's) homeland, the land of Ur, was located in southern Mesopotamia in modern day Iraq. Abram first traveled northwest to Haran in modern day Turkey. Then he traveled southwest to the land of Canaan.
- Job's homeland, the land of Uz, was likely Idumea, the site of Petra, along the southern edge of the Dead Sea. Today, this area is on the border between the countries of Israel and Jordan.
- Job is struggling with the unimaginable loss of everything dear to him: his career, savings, employees, health, ten children, and the support of his wife. Amazingly, he does not curse God.

Look for this:

- 1. The role God played in creation (Gen 1-2); The conversation in heaven (Job 1)
- 2. What factors caused the fall of mankind in the garden (Gen 3); What Job decided to curse instead of God (Job 3)
- 3. What role faith played in the building the ark (Gen 6-8); How Eliphaz claimed God spoke to him (Job 5)

- 4. What role independence from God played at Babel (Gen 11); Who Bildad blamed for the death of Job's children (Job 8)
- 5. What role faith played in Abram's journey to Canaan (Gen 12); The difficulty Job felt in approaching God (Job 9)
- 6. What role faith played in Isaac's birth (Gen 16-17); Zophar's lack of compassion (Job 11)
