Tips:

- Genesis 22 is one of the richest prophetic pictures in the Bible. Abraham the ancient father (i.e. God the Father) escorts his beloved son Isaac (i.e. Jesus) to offer him as a sacrifice (i.e. the cross). The events even transpire on Mt. Moriah in the city of Jerusalem (2Chr 3:1) where Christ would be crucified.
- Three of Job's friends arrive in chapter two to comfort him in his affliction. They did a wonderful job of sitting quietly and supporting him for seven days. However when they speak, an angry torrent of godly truth and false accusation rushes out. Notice that Job's three friends are taking turns responding three times to him:
