**Tips:**

- Leviticus details the laws by which Israel could “be holy” (live set apart for God’s purposes). The laws also proved that people needed a Savior (Rom 8:2-4) and foreshadowed the coming of Christ (Heb 10:1, 12; Col 2:16-17).
- Read 1Chronicles 16:1-9. Notice that the intended audience for the psalms is God. We are to sing them to Him (or pray them to Him). In addition, the psalms document God’s perfect character and mighty works which encourages us to praise God.

**Look for this:**

50. How Israel was to watch out for leprosy as we are to watch out for sins (Lev 13); What the psalmist said was a blessing (Psa 40)
51. The picture of the sinfulness of the flesh (Lev 15); What the psalmist was thirsting for (Psa 42)
52. What the high priest had to bring to the mercy seat (Lev 16); How much God, the King, loves His people (Psa 45)
53. What reason God gave Israel to be holy (Lev 19); Why people can have confidence in God (Psa 46)

54. How important sexual purity is to God (Lev 20); How God desires us to repay Him for being delivered (Psa 50)
55. How important it is to pause and celebrate God (Lev 23); How broken, transparent, and repentant David was (Psa 51)
