Tips:

- Numbers records why Israel wandered 40 years in the wilderness instead of traveling 11 days (Deu 1:2). The generation that was miraculously delivered from Egypt the previous year did not believe God was able to defeat their new enemies. Therefore that generation could not enter the Promised Land (Numbers 13-14).
- Numbers derives its title from two censuses (“numberings”) at the start and end of the 40 years. The book itself covers 38 years and 10 months (Num 1:3, Deu 1:3).
- Numbers teaches us the importance of believing God’s promises ourselves in order to enter our “Promised Land,” the state of resting in God and His promises (Heb 3-4).
- Many believe “Selah,” which appears 73 times in Psalms, was a musical notation for “rest.” Experiment with pausing yourself when you read “Selah” to ponder the verse you just read.

cares for orphans, widows, and the isolated (Psa 68)
