Tips:

- Numbers 21 contains a rich prophetic picture of what Jesus would do at the cross. First, Israel sinned by falsely accusing God and Moses. Then Israel was judged by being bitten by serpents (i.e. Satan, Gen 3:1, Rev 12:9). Some died from the bite; others confessed their sins. God told Moses to offer healing to the people by attaching a serpent to a pole (i.e. a picture of Christ on the cross, John 3:14). If anyone believed and looked to the serpent on the pole, they would live (they would receive the gift of Christ by faith, Rom 6:23).
- The psalms are organized into five sub-books each ending with a doxology (i.e. an “expression of praise”). Note the doxologies at the end of each book: Psalm 41, 72, 89, 106, and 150.

Look for this:

71. How a single moment of anger cost Moses the land (Num 20);
How many times Asaph cried out for God’s help (Psa 80)
72. How Balaam disobeyed by leaving before being called (Num 22);
How God responded when Israel rejected His counsel (Psa 81)
73. How God turned a curse into a blessing (Num 23, Deu 23:5); What characteristics the psalmist ascribed to God (Psa 86)

74. What God promised Phinehas for protecting Israel (Num 25);
What the psalmist asked God (Psa 88)
75. How Joshua was selected as Moses' replacement (Num 27);
What God promised David and his descendants (Psa 89)
76. How God valued both soldiers and their supporters (Num 31);
What a thousand years on earth are to God
