Tips:

- Deuteronomy literally means “second [giving of the] law.” The book records how Moses gave the Law to Israel a second time, for a new generation preparing to enter the Promised Land.
- Deuteronomy records the last month of Israel’s 40 years of wandering. It begins with Israel encamped east of Jericho across the Jordan River. Moses recounts what God did for them, presents the Law, and challenges Israel to show their love for God through their obedience to Him.
- Deuteronomy 6:4-9 is one of the most well-known and beloved Scriptures for the Jews. It is called the “Shema” (Hebrew for “Hear”). It contains perhaps the greatest affirmation of monotheism in all of Scripture (“The LORD is one”). Jesus quoted it as the greatest commandment (Mark 12:29-30).
- Examine Psalm 105 for examples of “Hebrew parallelism,” a literary device common to Hebrew poetry where parallel phrases are used for comparison or contrast.

Look for this:

- 78. Why Israel was to drive all enemies from the land (Num 33); How God protected those who made Him their refuge (Psa 91)
- 79. How people were freed by the high priest's death (Num 35); What type of song we are to sing to God (Psa 96)
- 80. Why Moses said Israel should not fear the inhabitants (Deu 1); What people were supposed to know about God (Psa 100)
- 81. What Moses said Israel lacked during their 40 years (Deu 2); How far Israel's sins were removed from them (Psa 103)
- 82. How Israel was to honor and use the Word of God (Deu 4); What the psalmist said clothed God (Psa 104)
- 83. When parents were to teach their children the Bible (Deu 6); Who was promised God's covenant (Psa 105)
