### Tips:

- The Chronicles record much of the same history as Kings and Samuel. Chronicles differ in a variety of ways:
  - ▶ Focusing only on the southern kingdom of Judah
  - ▶ Emphasizing the Jewish Temple
  - ▶ Ending with the decree to allow the captives to return
- The exacting detail of the genealogies played an important role in Israel after their captivity. They reestablished each tribe's membership and documented the ancestral lines of the priests and Messiah.
- The gospel of Mark records two miracles not found in the other gospels: healing the deaf and mute man (Mark 7:31-37) and healing the blind man at Bethsaida (Mark 8:22-25).
