Tips:

- Isaiah preached to the southern kingdom of Judah (Isa 1:1) for at least 60 years. Isaiah warned Judah to return to God both before and after the northern kingdom of Israel went into exile.
- The book of Isaiah is filled with prophecies about the Messiah, including His virgin birth (Isa 7:14, Mat 1:23) and Divine reign (Isa 9:6-7, Rev 12:5). Some prophecies are fulfilled two or three times: (1) historically in the days of Judah, (2) at Christ's first coming, and (3) at Christ's second coming.
- The gospel of John presents Jesus as the Son of God, recording many of Jesus' "I am" claims. Jesus said, "I am" the bread of life (John 6:35); light of the world (John 8:12); door of the sheep (John 10:7); good shepherd (John 10:11); resurrection and life (John 11:25), way, truth, and life (John 14:6); and true vine (John 15:1).

- 236.How Isaiah foresaw Christ’s first and second coming (Isa 11); Why the believing Pharisees hid their belief in Jesus (John 12)
- 237.What were the five “I will” statements against God (Isa 14); What Jesus did to model how we are to serve one another (John 13)
