**Tips:**

- Isaiah gives a series of dark prophecies that expand in vision from Judah to Israel to Gentile nation to the whole earth. The Gentile nations are the focus of Isaiah 13-23. The earth is the focus of Isaiah 24-27.
- The key word in Isaiah is “salvation,” which appears 28 times. The name Isaiah means “salvation of Jehovah.”
- The Apostle John had a special relationship with Jesus. Five times, we see about John that he is the apostle “whom Jesus loved” (John 13:23, 19:26, 20:2, 21:7, 21:20). John was the only apostle at the cross (John 19:26).

**Look for this:**

239. How Isaiah wept over Moab’s fall instead of rejoicing (Isa 16);  
 Who can come to God without going through Jesus (John 14)
240. How Isaiah warned Judah not to rely on Egypt (Isa 20); How Jesus said His “branches” (us) would bear fruit (John 15)
