**Tips:**

- Some people compare Isaiah to a “mini-Bible.” It has 66 chapters. The first 39 chapters are similar in theme to the 39 books of the Old Testament. The last 27 chapters are similar in theme to the 27 chapters of the New Testament. (Note: The Bible did not have chapter divisions until the 13th century.)
- The book of Acts is a transition book recording what happened to the apostles and church after Jesus ascended to heaven. The story follows the outline Jesus gave in Acts 1:8 from Judea to Samaria to Gentiles around the world.
- Luke wrote both the Gospel of Luke and the book of Acts (Luke 1:1-4, Acts 1:1-3). Luke’s focus was Jesus’ life and Acts focus was Jesus’ legacy.
