**Tips:**

- Jeremiah initially resisted the call to preach (Jer 1:6), but did accept God’s call (Jer 2:2) to minister to the southern kingdom of Judah.
- The book of Jeremiah is not chronological. The organization is topical.
- Jeremiah continually mourned over Judah’s sin against God. Some people call him the “weeping prophet” (Jer 9:1, 13:17, 14:17).
- Paul followed God’s plan regardless of the consequences. He became a “prisoner of the Lord” (Acts 21:10-14, Eph 3:1). He wrote to churches from prison to encourage and challenge them.
