**Tips:**

- Jeremiah was overwhelmed by the knowledge of the people’s rejection of God and God’s impending judgment (Jer 15:17-18). At times, Jeremiah wanted to quit. However he remained faithful to God’s calling as His messenger (Jer 20:7-13).
- The book of Romans is Paul’s letter to the church at Rome. Though Paul had not yet been to Rome, he prayed constantly for the church (Rom 1:8-9), planned to visit (Rom 1:10-15, 15:28-33), and knew many people by name (Rom 16:3-15).
- The theme of Romans is the gospel (or “good news”). The key verse says that the gospel is the power of God (Rom 1:16). The book has three parts. Romans 1-8 explains how the gospel saves the sinner. Romans 9-11 explains how the gospel relates to Israel. Romans 12-16 explains how the gospel affects our conduct.
