Tips:

- Even though he was in exile, the prophet Ezekiel was a happily married man with a home in Babylon. He faced more tragedy when his wife suddenly died [Eze 24:15-18].
- The book of Ephesians is Paul's letter to a church he planted (located in modern Turkey). Paul spent two years spreading the gospel (Acts 19:8-10). Paul wrote to reveal the mystery of the church as Christ's body (Eph 3:2-6). The book has two sections. Ephesians 1-3 reveals truths about our riches in Christ. Ephesians 4-6 contains practical applications for our daily walk in Christ.
- The book of Philippians is Paul's letter to a church (located in modern Macedonia, north of Greece). Originally, Paul led his missionary team there because of a vision (Acts 16:9-12). Paul wrote to urge the church to maintain unity of mind, heart, and purpose (Php 1:27, 2:2, 3:16, 4:2). Although Paul wrote from prison, this is the epistle of joy and rejoicing (mentioned 16 times).

Look for this:

What role good works play before and after salvation (Eph 2)
- 310. Why God said the sour grapes proverb was not true (Eze 18);
What we do with God's truth to grow up spiritually (Eph 4)

Paul asked people to pray for while he was in jail (Eph 6)
- 312. Why the prophets, priests, and princes angered God (Eze 22);
What Christ did for us which showed great humility (Php 2)
- 313. Why the "two sisters" angered God (Eze 23); Why Paul believed he
had the strength to do anything (Php 4)
- 314. Why God told Ezekiel not to mourn his wife's death (Eze 24); Why
we are to proclaim and teach Christ to everyone (Col 1)
