2Kings

The book of [2Kings](#), records how the ten northern tribes (Israel) and two southern tribes (Judah) continued to drift away from God while ignoring the prophets' warnings. Ultimately, both kingdoms were soundly defeated by enemy nations, deported from their lands, and held in captivity.

The northern ten tribes of Israel were taken into captivity in two phases ([2Kings 15:29](#), [2Kings 18:11](#)) and the southern two tribes of Judah in three phases ([2Kings 24:2](#), [2Kings 24:14](#), [2Kings 25:11](#)).

Elijah

Elijah, who ascended to heaven ([2Kings 2](#)), is important in end-times theology.

- The Jews believed Elijah would precede the Messiah ([Mat 17:10](#)).
- They wondered if John the Baptist was Elijah ([John 1:21](#)).
- Elijah met Jesus on the mount ([Mat 17:3](#)).
- Today, Jews leave an empty seat for Elijah at Passover dinner.

Personal Reflection and Application

Notice what Hezekiah did when he received a threatening letter from the Assyrians ([2Kings 19:14-19](#)). He spread the letter out before the Lord and prayed.

- When troubles come, before thinking of fixing things yourself, do you lay them out before God and ask for His guidance and protection?
- What will help you remember to seek God first?

Small Group Conversation Guide

King Manasseh did more evil than the Amorites ([2Kings 21:11](#)). Sadly, some Christians, even leaders, behave more wickedly than non-believers. We are each accountable for our own behavior.

Discuss the challenges of showing proper submission to those in authority while being the person God wants you to be.
