Lamentations

Author

Jeremiah wrote the book of [Lamentations](#) after witnessing the city of Jerusalem fall to the Babylonian Empire in 587 B.C.

Lamentations records God's anger and Jeremiah's despair over this beautiful city that God once blessed.

Key Verses

The key verses are [Lamentations 3:22-23](#) where the tone changes from utter despair to hopefulness in God's mercy.

Book Outline

The book of Lamentations is a series of five poems. Each is a lament about the fall of Jerusalem.

Lam 1	1-11: Jeremiah cries out with grief; 12-22: Jerusalem mourns its situation
Lam 2	1-12: description of God's anger; 13-22: God expresses His anger
Lam 3	1-39: affliction, yet hope; 40-66: plea, national and personal
Lam 4	1-11: explanation for God's anger; 12-22: how the Gentile nations view God's anger
Lam 5	1-18: Jerusalem pleads with God; 19-22: Jerusalem appeals to God's faithfulness
