
Leadership Principles from Isaiah

Send Me (Demonstrate Core Values)

Read [Isaiah 6:5-8](#). If you saw the Lord on His Throne, you would respond as Isaiah did, "Woe is me!" You would know that everything you have [talents, time, treasure] are from Him. You would know that He gave those things to you for a reason.

When the Lord asked, "Whom shall I send...?" would you respond as Isaiah did, "Here am I! Send me"?

You could define Christian leadership as simply listening to God and doing what He says. In this case, Isaiah heard from God and said "yes" even before he received his mission.

Do you have that kind of total abandonment to God? Are you willing to say, "Yes God! Now, what do you want me to do?"

Are You a Servant Leader (Engage Others)

Beware of unjustly treating those over whom you have authority ([Isa 10:1-6](#)). God condemns oppressive leaders. God looks for servant leaders such as:

- ▶ Abraham ([Gen 26:24](#))
- ▶ Moses ([Exo 14:31](#))
- ▶ Caleb ([Num 14:24](#))
- ▶ Samuel ([1Sam 3:9](#))
- ▶ Elijah ([2Kings 9:36](#))
- ▶ Isaiah ([Isa 20:3](#))
